2011 Atlantic Canada Piobaireachd Challenge

The following tunes only may be submitted for the 2011 Atlantic Canada Piobaireachd Challenge events on June 3rd. If settings used are taken from sources other than the Kilberry (K) or Piobaireachd Society (PS) collections, competitors must be prepared to provide the judge with a copy of the tune in the setting to be played. The judge may take into consideration the merits of the setting played.

Gold Medal Event Only: Tunes may be submitted from the Senior Piobaireachd (Clasp), Gold Medal and Silver Medal lists for 2011. See the Piobaireachd Society of Scotland's website for the full list of approved tunes. <http://www.piobaireachd.co.uk/> and click on Set Tunes.

Silver, Nickel, Bronze, Copper and Pewter Medal Events: Tunes may be submitted from the following list only: "The Battle of Auldearn. No 1" (PS 2); "The Battle of Strome," (PS 5); "The End of the Great Bridge," (PS 2, K); "The Gathering of the MacNabs," (PS 5, K); "The Glen is Mine," (PS 6, K); "Glengarry's March," (PS 2, K) No; "MacDonald's (or Duntroon's) Salute," (PS 6); "The Park Piobaireachd No. 2," (PS 4, K)

Submission Requirements: Gold Medal – four (4) tunes from the Clasp, Gold and/or Silver Medal lists; Silver Medal – three (3) tunes from the Silver Medal list; Nickel Medal - two (2) tunes from the Silver Medal list; Bronze Medal - one (1) tune from the Silver Medal list; Copper Medal – one (1) tune from the Silver Medal list. (Note: a mach variations are not required at the Copper and Bronze Medal levels. If played, however, they will be judged); Pewter Medal – Ground and 1st Variation Singling only of one (1) tune from the Silver Medal list.

In events where more than one tune is to be submitted, the judge will select the tune to be played and competitors will be notified prior to their playing time.

Restrictions:

Gold Medal event – Open to Professional Class pipers only.

Silver Medal event – Open to Grade 1 pipers only.

Nickel Medal event – Open to Grade 2 pipers only.

Bronze Medal event – Open to Grades 3 pipers only.

Copper Medal event – Open to Grade 4 pipers only.

Pewter Medal event – Open to Grade 5 pipers only.

Competitors from Atlantic Canada must be current members of the ACPBA. Competitors from other jurisdictions must be members of their own regional associations.

In all events, tuning time before the judge must be kept to a minimum.

Order of Play: Last to enter in each event plays first. Competitors are asked to present themselves to the judge within three minutes of the completion of the previous competitor's performance. The order of play will be posted.

Entry Fee: All entries must be accompanied by a cheque or money order in the amount of \$10.00 made payable to **The Antigonish Highland Society**.

Deadline for entries: Friday, May 20th. Absolutely no late entries and no telephone entries accepted.
